



Similarly, in our Christian walk, our responses to life's afflictions reveal our level of spiritual growth.

"That he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our life."




Contaminated Faith (continued)

Show Up (find the next right thing to do)

Sometimes we need to show up to know the next step or our next assignment. You walk into a room, and someone says, "Good, you are here, can you ..." For God, He sees you show up in prayer, bible study, commitments, serving (where you are seen or not seen), showing up in worship, praise, encouragement, leading. And in this place, you are hearing your next step, assignment, answer to prayer, or seeing Him move in a way unexpected. The moment could be missed if you were not in position. Sitting on your hands, waiting may not get you anywhere, because the next thing may come in a way entirely unimagined by you.

I have told this story before about how the Lord took care and guided me in one specific way. One day something happened to my eye to the extent I was losing sight and immediately left work and drove home while I could still see. Overnight vision got better, but I had an appointment with my eye doctor the next day. He looked me over, said I was okay, gave me a prescription, and requested a referral from my primary physician. That was my only focus when I made the appointment with my primary care doctor. I just wanted him to write the referral so I could rush it back to my eye doctor. My new primary physician thought I was rushing things and started asking me questions. I was getting a little irritated; I needed this document, my immediate health concern had been resolved, so I wanted to move on. He asked if he could take my blood pressure, (sure fine, whatever, get this over with and let me have my piece of paper). He took my pressure, and calmly said it was too high; looking at a chart on his wall, it was at the edge of the range when it causes organ damage or stroke. Now I am sitting there thinking, what! I mean yea, I experienced headaches (frequently), attributed it to my lifestyle, working late, and looking at a computer screen all day. The fact that I went through a bottle of pain killers monthly (I had Anacin in my purse always), I thought, was just a fact of my life. The doctor prescribed pills that day and told me to go home and take them, come back in a week. Not too many days later, I was in emergency with my pressure sky high, sent from my doctor's office. I like to say God messed with my eyes (which certainly got my attention) to get me to take care of my blood pressure. Praise Him, it is regulated now, and it has been years. Show up, get into position, and you may see the right path to take, the Lord promised to guide us. I had been putting off a doctor appointment for a while.

So if you are worried about going the right way, just show up for the things you know you should, and the right path, God's plan, could be revealed or how God is going to get you through the journey you are on, particularly in the times we are in.

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
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The Fruit of the Holy Spirit
