- In the New Testament, the word "new" is an important word translated as "mostly kainos," "new," "fresh," and "newly made." We also have the title of the "New Testament" itself, rightly given by the American Standard Revised Version as "New Covenant" (2 Corinthians 3:6, Hebrews 8:8).

Remember, do not look back. It is impossible to cancel or destroy what has happened in the past. God is doing a new thing.





A possible remedy for doubt:


- D deposit


If in doubt, wait; God's time is not like ours; it does not run out; it transitions. God just moves on to the next thing He planned.


