# The Legendary Woman - God's Secret Weapon

At the recent Daughters of Hope retreat, I spoke about God's "secret weapon" from the book, "Legendary Woman" by Michelle McClain-Walters. I encourage you to check out the book if you have not already done so. Legendary women are stealthy warriors; they are strong in silence, able to keep their strength and power in check, and ready to take orders from the Lord. So when it is time to take action, she can be accurate because she knows what God wants her to do.



Now, we will find out how this woman, Jael (Judges Chapters 4 and 5), was ready for the battle; her name is only mentioned in these two chapters in the Bible.

Israel sinned against the Lord, and "He sold them into the hand of Jabin, King of Canaan" (Judges 4:2). Because of the "harshness that was put upon them, they cried out to the Lord" (Judges 4:3). The prophetess Deborah heard from the Lord that the men of Israel were to go into battle with Canaan. She knew the Lord commanded Barak to go with troops against Sisera, the commander of the Canaan army. Barak asked Deborah to go with him, because "if you will not go with me, I will not go" (Judges 4:8). By Barak asking Deborah to go with him, he would not get the glory for this battle. The glory goes to this stealthy, quiet, meek woman named Jael.

Jael, the wife of Heber, lived in a tent, and "in this time women pitched the tent" (Judges 4:17). So, Jael was prepared for her assignment. She was able to execute her assignment accurately and silently. Sisera, the commander of the army, "came right to her tent" (Judges 4:17). She let him come in, and he got comfortable and went to sleep. "She took a hammer in her hand and drove a peg into his temple" (Judge 4:21). In Judges 5:24-27 (NIV), Deborah sings, "Most blessed of women be Jael, the wife of Heber the Kenite, most blessed of tent-dwelling women. He asked for water, and she gave him milk; in a bowl fit for nobles, she brought him curdled milk. Her hand reached for the tent peg, her right hand for the workman's hammer. She struck Sisera, she crushed his head, she shattered and pierced his temple. At her feet he sank, he fell; there he lay. At her feet he sank, he fell; where he sank, there he fell—dead."



Remember, whatever you are going through is a preparation for God's assignment to be carried out through you. You are God's secret weapon to destroy the enemy. Legendary Women of God, you have been given unique skills and abilities to be a warrior for Him. Don't give up, don't be lazy, don't think you are not good enough, and don't think you are too young or too old. God is calling you to be His stealthy warrior. He needs you to be His hands and feet in an ongoing battle to protect those He loves.




















# The Legendary Woman: Passionate for His Presence

# Stay In Your Lane

In Hebrews 12, the scripture talks about the race set before us. We did not choose it; it was given to us. Admittedly, if we were in the room when assignments from God are handed out, we would not raise our hand and say I will take that one. The truth is that God has faith in us and plans to go through the assignment with us. The choice we get is to run the race and recognize the obstacles we need to remove so we can be our best. If God did not care for us or how well we do, He would not take the time to correct and re-direct us along this journey.



You are in your lane, taking step by step while other people are in their lanes running their race. Your race of endurance may be parenting young children or coaching young adult children; there is much to learn and missteps that will happen in this race. Your race can involve being a caregiver for a family member; the energy required can be overwhelming at times. Your lane can be building a ministry or company; occasions to quit come to mind and may be more frequent than you thought when you accepted the task. There are many races; you know yours.

The key is to see yourself in training. Important things take place in training, including growth and transformation. We think and act one way in the beginning, but over time, if we follow instructions, we change. Training also involves sacrifice. God's word promises that there will be a time when we will have peace and see the fruit of righteousness, "the peaceable fruit of righteousness" that comes through following Christ.

We discipline ourselves in our eating, exercise, time management, or sometimes what comes out of our mouths. Our human effort sometimes renders no long-term positive change. But the hand of God genuinely presses until there is a change; otherwise, we will lose out on what we do not know. The discipline of God can push hard and cause us to be discouraged. As rough as the path gets, the word says we have not experienced the worst in endurance; we have not bled in sweat. While in training, you are building on your relationship with God, depending on Him to get you over the next hurdle, talking with Him, and seeking wisdom and understanding. The training is strengthening you in more ways than one.



# Which Road Are You On?

The Bible states that there are two roads in life: one leads to eternal joy in Heaven and the other to eternal punishment in Hell. We must understand that we cannot earn our way to Heaven through good works or religious activity. We can only earn our way to Heaven if we turn to God and put our faith in Jesus Christ, who died for us and rose again, giving us that blessed hope to spend eternity with God in Heaven.

Taken from the Book of Romans, the following series of key verses can help you understand the journey to salvation and ensure that you are on the right path to Heaven.

- Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." This verse establishes the
  universal condition of humanity: sinfulness. Regardless of background or circumstance, everyone is subject to
  the human condition of sin, which separates us from God.
- Romans 6:23a "For the wages of sin is death..." Here, the consequences of sin are made clear. Sin leads to spiritual death, an eternal separation from God. This death includes not only physical death but also spiritual and eternal separation from God's presence.
- Romans 6:23b "...but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Despite the dire consequences of sin, there is hope. This verse introduces the concept of God's grace, a gift freely given to humanity through Jesus Christ. Salvation is not something earned but received through faith in Jesus.
- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." This verse highlights the sacrificial love of God manifested in the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus' death on the cross serves as the atoning sacrifice for humanity's sins, demonstrating God's love and desire for reconciliation with His creation.
- Romans 10:9-10 "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God
  raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified,
  and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." These verses emphasize the role of
  confession and belief in securing salvation. It is not merely an intellectual acceptance but a heartfelt belief in
  Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior that leads to salvation.
- Romans 10:13 "For, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Salvation is available to all who call upon the name of Jesus. There are no prerequisites or qualifications; salvation is accessible to anyone who genuinely seeks it.

Walking down the Romans Road will lead you to a personal relationship with God. It involves acknowledging sins, recognizing the need for salvation, believing in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, confessing that belief, and calling upon His name for salvation. It is a journey of faith, repentance, and surrender that leads to the gift of eternal life and reconciliation with God.

Are you ready to accept God's gift of salvation and walk down the road to eternal life in Heaven? If so, recite this prayer, and be mindful that it is not just reciting this prayer that saves us; instead, it is a genuine heart transformation and repentance that leads to salvation.

"Heavenly Father, I recognize that I am a sinner and that the penalty for sin is death. I believe You sent Your Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the price for my sins. I declare that Jesus is my Lord and Savior and place my faith in His death and resurrection. Thank You for Your grace, forgiveness, peace, and the gift of eternal life. Amen!"

As you continue to grow in your relationship with God, deepening your faith comes by hearing the word of God, prayer, meditation, Bible study, and connecting with a church where you can continue on your spiritual maturing journey. Romans 10:17 – "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."
