As Jesus said in Matthew 5:14-16 (The Message Bible):




"Not so," said the wise, with steady tone,

Which Voice Will You Answer?

Proverbs 9 of the Bible talks of the voice of wisdom and the voice of foolishness. In this new year, we tend to make plans to do better or want a better year than the last one. Perhaps you had a good year in 2024 and want things to continue going well. Whatever your hope, path, and future, the voice you follow can affect it.

In Proverbs 9, the voice of wisdom makes preparations, sets the table, and is ready to receive whoever will. The voice of wisdom sends out agents to make sure the invitation is heard. The voice of wisdom offers something good for the soul, something meaningful for the inner man.

The voice of foolishness also offers an invitation, often something that will feed the flesh or make the self feel good, but only for a time. These two enticing voices appeal to our well-being, but a check in our spirit can let us know if the invitation is for the long or short term. One invitation leads to death: death of a vision, death of a planned future, or death of a dream. The other leads to something solid that will stand, an inheritance that sustains.

Both voices call out from high places in the city, prominent places in our lives, noticeable places, life decisions, and turning points. The audible or impression you hear could be through someone or something you read. Pay attention to how you are drawn to the voices. What do you want from your job? Sound instructions on how to do the job better, or not a lot of work or no hard work? Do you not want to hear why your husband does not agree with getting a new car or see yourself driving it, taking those road trips you have been dreaming of, and off you go buying it with "your own" money? When parenting, what's wise, giving your child more freedom and material things or giving them more life survival skills and character building? Which voice are you going to yield to?

In this scripture the voices are in the same surroundings, calling out, so you may hear both when deciding. How can you distinguish one from the other? Which invitation will you accept? True wisdom comes from God and not always man, though man may have abundant years. Spend time in the book of Proverbs of the Bible; a lot is said about the differences between foolishness and wisdom. God is not just waiting on you to come to Him for wisdom, but He is coming after you to offer it, choose well.

Foolish:

- Not recognizing the authority that comes from God.
- Do not acknowledge what the Lord has done for you.
- Violating God's command.

Wise:

- Discerns a situation and seeks to understand
- Reverence for God
- Wisdom gets more wisdom

What Does Love Have To Do With It?

In a world filled with questions about love, one that we at times ask ourselves is, "What does love have to do with it?" For those who are seeking meaning and purpose in their lives and relationships, this question finds its most thoughtful answer in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. His story reveals that love is not just a momentary emotion or a romantic passion, but "love" is the very essence of life and faith in Jesus Christ.

- ▶ Love Is Why He Came The Bible declares in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." At the heart of Jesus' mission was love, and this verse reveals the foundation of Jesus' ministry, that is love. He did not come to condemn the world but to seek and save it. He entered into the messiness of humanity, walking alongside the broken, the outcast, and the weary. His love was not passive, but was active. It reached out to touch the untouchable, to heal the sick, to forgive the sinner, and to restore hope to the hopeless.
- ▶ Love Is Why He Stayed In John 15:13, Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this: than to lay down one's life for his friends." Throughout His life, Jesus faced rejection, misunderstanding, and suffering. Yet He remained steadfast, driven by a love that transcended human comprehension. When others fled, Jesus stayed. When His disciples faltered, Jesus forgave. When the weight of the cross became unbearable, Jesus carried it anyway. His love was not just spoken but demonstrated through sacrifice. On the cross, Jesus bore the weight of humanity's sin, offering Himself as the ultimate act of love.
- ▶ Love Is Why He Conquered Romans 8:38-39 reminds us, "For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." The story does not end at the cross. Love carried Jesus into the grave, but it also brought Him out of it. The resurrection is the ultimate proof that love is more powerful than death, sin, and despair. Through His resurrection, Jesus offers a love that cannot be defeated, a love that is eternal and unchanging.
- ▶ Love Is Why We Live 1 John 4:19 says, "We love Him because He first loved us." Jesus did not just come to show love; He came to transform us through it. His love is an invitation to a new way of living. As followers of Christ, we are called to reflect His love in our relationships, our communities, and our daily actions. This love compels us to forgive as we have been forgiven, to serve as Jesus served, and to sacrifice for others as He sacrificed for us.

So, What Does Love Have To Do With It? In the context of Jesus, love has everything to do with it. It is the reason for His coming, the motivation behind His actions, and the foundation of His teachings. Love is not an afterthought or a secondary theme, it is the essence of who Jesus is and what He offers to us.

For those who follow Jesus, His love is life changing that challenges us to live differently, to love boldly, and to trust deeply. It reminds us that even in our darkest moments, we are deeply and eternally loved. As you reflect on this question, "What does love have to do with it?," may you find the answer in the person of Jesus Christ, who has everything to do with love, and whose love changes everything.

- Acts 1:8: "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you."

- 2 Timothy 1:7, "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."

- 1 John 4:16, "And we have known and believed the love that God has for us.
 God is love, and who abides in love abides in God and God in him."
- John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son.
 That whosoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life."
- 1 Corinthians 13: 4-7, "Love is patient and kind. Love does not envy or boast. It
 is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way. It is not irritable or
 resentful. It does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. Love
 bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love
 never ends."

You Must Be Born Again!

Most people wish to spend eternity in heaven after they die. Just about everyone is familiar with John 3:16 which says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." When I was young, I thought a person who believed in Jesus by committing their life to Him would spend eternity in heaven and that coming forward in response to a pastor's altar call signified the commitment. The person would then receive the "Right Hand of Fellowship", his name would be written in the Lamb's Book of Life, and he would go to heaven when he died.

Since then, I have learned that there is much more to eternal salvation. The backstory is that when Adam and Eve sinned, the consequence of their sin was spiritual death and eternal separation from God. Everyone born since then inherit a sin nature and have a natural inclination to sin from birth. We are born spiritually dead, we commit and are guilty of our own sins, and are destined to spend eternity separated from God because of it. God is holy and Heaven, His dwelling place, is holy (Psalm 68:5). Because of our sinful nature, we are not capable of meeting the righteous requirements to be in His presence. The Good News is that God provided a plan of salvation through Jesus Christ. Jesus lived a sinless life and when He died on the cross, His death paid the price for the sin of all mankind. Jesus's death is substituted as payment for the sins of those who trust in Him as Savior.

When Nicodemus came to Jesus by night to inquire about the kingdom of heaven, Jesus told him that no one can enter the kingdom unless he is born again. The birth He was referring to is a spiritual birth, where one is born of the Holy Spirit. At conversion, those who trust in Jesus as Savior become new creations in Christ and receive a new divine nature. Ephesians 1:13-14 (TLB) says, "And because of what Christ did, all you others too, who heard the Good News about how to be saved, and trusted Christ, were marked as belonging to Christ by the Holy Spirit, who long ago had been promised to all of us Christians. His presence within us is God's guarantee that he really will give us all that he promised; and the Spirit's seal upon us means that God has already purchased us and that He guarantees to bring us to himself. This is just one more reason for us to praise our glorious God."

Spiritual birth is described on the website of www.gotquestions.org as follows:

When we place our faith in the risen Christ, a divine transaction takes place (2 Corinthians 5:21). God removes from us the sin, guilt, and condemnation we deserved because of our rebellion against Him. He throws our sin as far as the east is from the west (Psalm 103:12). At the moment of repentance and faith, the Holy Spirit breathes new life into us, and our bodies become His temple (1 Corinthians 3:16). Our spirits can now commune with God's Spirit as He assures us that we belong to Him (Romans 8:16).

It is not those who are "good" that enter heaven, but those who have been redeemed. Ephesians 2:8-9 (TLB) says, "Because of his kindness, you have been saved through trusting Christ. And even trusting is not of yourselves; it too is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good we have done, so none of us can take any credit for it."

The only path to heaven is through faith in Jesus Christ. He is the door.
