
But I believe this is also an opportunity, a sign that "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few," as Jesus said in Matthew 9:37-38 (NIV). The harvest Jesus refers to here is the souls of people, and the mission before us is clear: we are called to bring in that harvest for the Kingdom of God.





Are you ready to give an answer for the hope that lies within you? The Great Commission in Matthew 28:18-20 (MSG) speaks directly to this righteous harvest. Jesus, undeterred, gave His followers this charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age."

As Christians, we are not only part of the harvest, but we are also called to "re-seed" by sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The harvest is plentiful, and we must be prepared to give an answer to those seeking hope.

Keep Your Lamp Lit: Be Prepared in Every Season



In the Gospel of Matthew (25:1-13), Jesus shares the Parable of the Ten Virgins to emphasize the importance of spiritual readiness. In this story, ten virgins await the arrival of the bridegroom. Five are wise and bring extra oil for their lamps, while the other five are foolish and bring none. When the bridegroom is delayed, the foolish virgins' lamps run out of oil, and they must leave to buy more. During their absence, the bridegroom arrives, and they miss the wedding feast.

Matthew 25:1 KJV
Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom.

Imagine students who wait until the night before an exam to begin studying. In the rush, they struggle to grasp the material, and despite cramming, they feel unprepared during the test. This situation mirrors the lesson in the Parable of the Ten Virgins. Just as the foolish virgins were not ready for the bridegroom's arrival, the students were not prepared for the exam.

In our spiritual lives, we cannot rely on last-minute efforts to build our faith. Like the wise virgins who brought extra oil, we must nurture our relationship with God consistently—through prayer, the study of scripture, and acts of service—so that when challenges or unexpected moments arise, we are ready.

Just as students benefit from daily studying, we benefit from daily spiritual practices that keep our "lamps" filled and burning brightly.

The Parable of the Ten Virgins serves as a powerful reminder that we must be prepared for Christ's return. Spiritual readiness, symbolized by the oil, cannot be borrowed or acquired at the last moment. It requires ongoing faith, vigilance, and devotion. Just as the wise virgins were ready when the time came, we, too, must live our lives in constant spiritual preparation.

As we reflect on this parable, let's ask ourselves: Are we keeping our spiritual lamps lit? Are we prepared for Christ's arrival, whether it be today or years from now?

How is Your Vision?

I wear prescription glasses. Without them, I don't see clearly, and some things look blurry. When I put my glasses on, things become clearer, and I can see things as they really are. A worldview is a collection of attitudes, values, and expectations about the world around us. A person's worldview influences every thought he has and every action he takes. It determines his ethics, religion, philosophy, and scientific beliefs. It is like the lens through which a person sees the world.

At conversion, Christians become new creations in Christ and citizens of another kingdom. Our pre- and post-conversion worldviews should be very different. Having knowledge of who God is, the belief in the truths of scripture, and the fact the Holy Spirit comes to live within us, changes our perspective. As we grow and mature in our knowledge of the things of God, our view of life becomes clearer, and our thoughts and actions should change accordingly.

The idiom, "looking at life through rose-tinted glasses," means having a cheerful view of things, often without a valid basis. As Christians, when we view the world around us and our life experiences, we should view them through "scripture-tinted" or "Godcolored" glasses such that our vision of life is based on biblical truths. We should view things as God says they are, not how man, whom God created, defines them. The clarity of our vision is dependent upon our level of knowledge and acceptance of spiritual truths.

A couple of weeks ago, I needed to make several time-sensitive, life-altering decisions at the same time. I felt as if I had to juggle several egg-like balls at once, and the balls were all falling downward at the same time. At first, unfortunately, I spent several days allowing myself to be overwhelmed by them, while trying to figure out how to prevent them all from falling. Thank God for the indwelling Holy Spirt, who reminded me of several things:


- God has invited us to cast our cares on Him for He cares for us. I was carrying
 my burdens myself.
- God is sovereign. Nothing can happen in my life unless He allows it.
- And one of my favorite passages; Philippians 4:6-7 "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."


In response, I laid each of my burden-eggs at His feet, acknowledged His sovereignty, and reconfirmed in my mind that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose. I thanked Him for His promise to never leave or forsake me. As for my burden eggs, my conclusion was, "So, what if they all came crashing down? My God would still be with me."

My heart is no longer racing, and my thoughts are no longer filled with anxiety. My circumstances did not change, but how I view them did, allowing me to experience that peace that passes understanding. The Holy Spirit, our comforter and guide, helped me view my circumstances through scripture-tinted lenses!

In my words or my paraphrase for this verse: "My sisters and brothers in the Lord, look for the benefit when life hands you a bag of rocks, know this, that the strength and knowledge you will gain working with something hard and seemingly unchangeable, transforms you, completing the training you will need to finish the courses of your life."

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Hebrews 11:1 The Faith chapter, Hebrews 11, lists many who had Faith, some not seeing the outcome. They were commended for their Faith. But trusting in our Lord, who knows all and knows best, may let us see the result in the here and now, or in a future time. Remember, we are the children of God, and we must "seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (at no charge) Matthew 6:33.


By following these principles to transform and renew your mind, your mind will align with the mind of Christ, and you can fully embrace God's everlasting reward.
